3. Chairman's report

Chairman's Report Final AGM Coddington Community Association Charity 1116780

When the charity 'Coddington Community Association' was originally set up it was with the intention of a members who were able to vote on certain matters. However, over the years the active membership was seen to dwindle and become ineffective. To correct this and allow the trustees to make all the decisions an update to the charity structure was required.

Additionally, revisions and updates to the Charities Act which include some amendments in the favour of Trustees made it necessary to update our governing document. Also, since the charity started with all volunteers the move to employing staff is better supported by an updated governing document.

In order to affect these changes a new charity had to be set up with a new governing document. This has been completed. Our finances have been reviewed at the end of the financial year to conclude the business of the charity 'Coddington Community Association' and allow all business to be taken up by the new charity 'Coddington Community Association – CIO'. This change was made easier by not having any assets to transfer.

The new governing document brings us up to date with our operating methods in line with new technology and provides the trustees with more protection. The trustees are no longer liable for debts of the charity.

During the past 12 months, during the lockdown, our staff have been on furlough and we have been supported by the Newark and Sherwood District Council with support grants to cover operating costs. We have kept up with the certification of the building to maintain readiness for reopening. We are welcoming back our users along with some new bookings bringing more activities to the area.

We are currently looking into replacing the main hall lighting as the fittings are not reliable anymore. We are looking into installing new lighting which would make the hall more inviting for parties and other events which do not require the sports lighting.

I would like to thank the trustees and our employees for their support during the previous year and look forward to working with them in the next year.
